Haiti

My first trip to Haiti was rather overwhelming to say the least. While I didn't see the devourer, I did see his tracks. After three years of rebuilding, and ten thousand aide organizations in the country, the nation is still in desperate need.

I, along with a few strays, worked beside teams from Evangel in North Miami and Celebration International in Boston. Our objective was to hold medical clinics and a Pastor's Conference in the mountains, in and around Joligebert, Pestel, approximately eight hours by bus from Port a Prince. Our base camp comprised of a church building as the guys sleeping quarters and a location to hold the pastor's conference, as well as, a kitchen and eating area under a large tarp and a few smaller buildings to house the gals and supplies.

I'm not sure where all the pastors came from but seventy came by foot, boat, bus and motorcycle to be a part of the conference. We sang, we ate, we taught, we prayed, we read from their new bibles. For some this was their first complete bible, even after pastoring for years. Every scripture reference was read in English and French so they could use their new bibles. The lessons were simple, at times the questions were startling, due to their lack of knowledge, but their passion and dedication to God was deeply rooted.

I was able to travel with the medical team for a couple of days by bus and boat. The line-ups were long and the variety of medical conditions so varied. So much of the sickness could

be resolved by clean drinking and bathing water. The team worked tirelessly trying to help as many people as possible before it was time to travel back to base. Too many stories to tell, heart-

wrenching stories, but there is one that stays in my mind. A father came to the compound, with what I thought was his little girl. The little girl was actually a little boy, wearing all that he had, hand -me-downs from his older sister. In order to spare the life of

his son, the dad made a very difficult life-decision that day. He gave his son away to the care of Miriam, the orphanage founder, thereby ensuring his son would live.

The Caribbean



I told them, "That God had a plan for their lives and if they would get to know Him, they would know His will for their lives." When my time was up, I

handed the microphone to the Director who promptly handed it back and asked me to pray for the students. At the end of the assembly we were invited into the Principal's office where he asked us to pray for him. How cool is that!

What a great way to start the year...Jan 1st, two morning services in Toronto at Church on the Queensway, Russ Taff ministering in song and me preaching on Holy Spirit. Come on! Then onto Family Worship Centre in Courtice to conduct four nights of School of the Spirit. Awesome! Four services at Trinity in Montreal with Pastor's Ron and Anna Rust. What a beautiful facility for the people, but even more so, a place to cradle the presence of God for the city. I loved the lingering presence of God as we spent time around the altar, it was glorious! The following weekend, I had the pleasure to preach in Belleville at Calvary Temple, the place of my birth. Again, the presence of God was sweet as the utterance gifts of the Spirit spoke to the church. A HUGE thank you to the ladies of Calvary

Temple for the hundreds of boxes they have packed and donated to Reapers, for distribution to the needy of the world. The last three days of the month were spent in Marmora, ON, what a tremendous time we had in the presence of God. People came from many towns around the region to join us for these meetings and I know they were not disappointed. God is so faithful!
