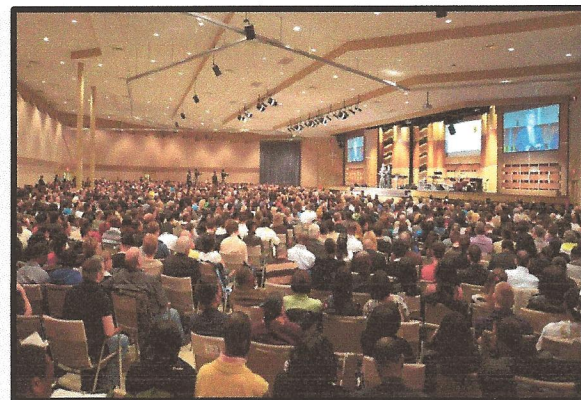

French Canada

Easter Sunday we ministered in Tweed with our friends the Sture's. Great to see people walk forward to renew their commitment to Christ. You have to love Resurrection Sunday, the empty promises of Easter...empty cross, empty grave clothes and empty tomb!

June was a fantastic month in northern Ontario traveling to six communities holding 22 services. I flew to Thunder Bay rented a car, actually a couple of them, due to rocks meeting the windshield. Saw more moose, bear, deer, rabbit and fox this month than in any other year of my life. Traveled paved, gravel, dirt and bush roads that my GPS basically said, "You are on your own pal".

My thanks to Mike Burt and Band from South Porcupine and Kevin Rogers and friends from Windsor for joining in and leading worship. Something about neutral territory outside the walls of a church building where non-churched feel comfortable to attend...way to go Bethany!

What a joy to spend a few days in Hompayne and Longlac holding services with Josh Quinn and Ken Desmarais. Just outside of Longlac is 'Reserve 58', where we held a Saturday evening service at the Community Centre. Most of those in the back rows were on a meth program and at the end of the evening most of the back row was at the altar for prayer. Please pray for these young Pastors and their families as they continue to make a difference in their communities.

After finishing up in the Section, I traveled farther north to Kenora, Dryden and Ignace for meetings. Only one night in Kenora but a good crowd and the subject matter was rich...Holy Spirit! Wrapped up the month preaching five services in Dryden and Ignace with Pastor Jonathan King, who pastors both communities. Great to see people hungry for a move of God. Great time in the Word and around the altars. The results - people's lives were changed and rearranged, seed was sown and watered and best of all, Sunday evening, the last service of the tour, a young man walked forward to receive Christ. Praise-allohuja!

Touching Generations

There were so many significant moments throughout the month of May. Allow me to highlight a few, beginning with preaching Mother's Day at Warden Full Gospel. I had the opportunity to share the message "Then Hannah Prayed", which would have been my tribute at Mom's home-going, but due to incimate weather in Labrador I was not able to attend. It wasn't about closure, more about the power of prayer, the reach of a Mother's love and the faithfulness of God.

The following week Trish and I traveled to Kitchener to preach at New Song with Dave and Shannon Mischuk. We have known Dave for 26 years, he is a Son in the Gospel. We love his heart for God and people. We wanted to see their new building a bi-product of what God is doing in people's lives. Wow... super facility, plenty of room to grow and go. Congrat's New Song!

Traveled to Kinburn to be a part of their 100th Anniversary Celebration. How fitting that our first PAOC church is in Revival mode and breathing fire in the region and beyond. I spoke Thurs. and Fri. to a packed house with people from as far away as Montreal, Kingston and many from all across the Ottawa Valley. Pastor Mark keep

I spent the last weekend of the month in Bancroft with Pastor Steve Heathcock preaching at the Tabernacle.
